RSTP is pleased to announce that enrollment for the winter session of the etraining course **SWT101 – NAVIGATING PRIVATE SPONSORSHIP FOR SETTLEMENT WORKERS** is now open! Graduates of the course will receive a certificate. This ecourse is available at no cost!

ABOUT THE COURSE

This online course is intended for settlement workers and other settlement service providers who work with privately sponsored refugees and their sponsors. The course is designed to provide essential information about the Private Sponsorship of Refugees (PSR) program, and how to successfully navigate the unique relationships between settlement workers, privately sponsored newcomers, and their sponsors.

There are five learning modules which include weekly readings, quizzes and discussion forum questions, as well as a final exam. Participants can take the training at a time that works best for them, but will also have an opportunity to join weekly video chat sessions to gain a deeper understanding of how integral their role is in supporting successful refugee sponsorships.
