

2021 Census Webinar Series: Age, Sex at Birth and Gender, Type of Dwelling

On April 27, 2022, Statistics Canada will be releasing the second set of results from the 2021 Census of Population.

This release will explore Canada's shifting demographic profile, and for the first time ever, will include data about the gender diversity of our population.

Additional questions on sex-at-birth and gender were added to the 2021

Census to allow more Canadians to be better represented.

Data about age and the various types of dwellings in Canada will also be released.

The Canadian Housing Statistics Program (CHSP) is an innovative data project that provides Canadians with wide-ranging housing statistics by leveraging existing data sources. Key indicators from the CHSP include characteristics of residential properties (assessment value, property type, period of construction, living area) and of their owners (income, age, residency, and immigration status). This webinar will cover updates to the CHSP, including new information on home buyers and expanded geographies.

Information Session: Introduction to Some Key Elements of a Well-Designed Questionnaire

Description:

In this session, we will look at key elements of a questionnaire that encourage respondents to complete a survey. The focus will be on elements such as the introduction, accompanying text as well as appeal, and not on the different ways of formulating the questions. The objective is to provide those who occasionally design questionnaires practical advice to help make a questionnaire stand out. This session is intended for beginners. Some familiarity with basic statistical concepts would be beneficial/advantageous but not required.




