



STUDY ABOUT **MEN WHO TRADE SEX** FOR THINGS THEY NEED OR WANT



Participants must:

- Be age 18 or older for informed consent.
- · Identify as male and/or transmasculine.
- Currently work in the sex trade in NL and have done so for at least 6 months, serving female and/or male clients.
- Work in any aspect of the sex trade such as online, exotic dancing, escort, porn, trading sex outdoors or in cars, etc.
- Live anywhere in NL and have access to reliable internet or cellular services for remote interviews and/or to maintain physical distancing during COVID-19.
- Be able to complete an interview in English.

INTERESTED?

Participation in this 90-minute study is completely voluntary and confidential. Interviews can be done either in-person or remotely via Zoom or phone. Demographic and health information will be requested prior to the interview. During the interview, you will be asked questions about your experiences as a male sex worker, in order to inform recommendations on policy and practice for meeting the needs of male sex workers in NL. Participants will be compensated with a \$40 honorarium.

I am doctoral candidate from the Geography Department at Memorial University of Newfoundland. As part of my PhD, I am conducting a study to learn about the public transit experiences of immigrants in St. John's Metro area and Halifax Regional Municipality. I also want to consider how the transit needs of these populations can be addressed. I hope that the information I collect can be used to provide better, more accessible information about transit in Newfoundland and Nova Scotia.

To be eligible to participate in this study, you:

- Are over the age of 18
- Currently live in St. John's Metro Area (permanently or temporarily) OR Halifax Regional Municipality (permanently or temporarily).
- Were born outside of Canada and have not spent more than 10 years in Canada
- First came to Canada as an international student, temporary worker, refugee (Protected Person), immigrant, and/or a visitor (tourist, or family member of one of the other categories)
- · Canadian citizens are eligible if they meet the above criteria

Health Services Utilization among African Immigrants in St. John NL

My name is Ukeme Eka, and I am a student in the Interdisciplinary Ph.D. Program at the Memorial University of Newfoundland. I am conducting a research project called Determinants of Access and Utilization of Health Care Services among African Immigrants in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador: for my Ph.D. degree under the supervision of Dr. Eric Tenkorang. The purpose of the study is to examine how African immigrants in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador access and utilizes health care services, specifically mental health and dental care services. - · Currently live in St. John's Metro Area (permanently or temporarily)
- Were you born in any of the countries on the continent of Africa and have not spent more than ten years in Canada
- First came to Canada as an international student, temporary worker, refugee (Protected Person), immigrant, and/or
 a visitor (tourist or family member of one of the other categories)
- Canadian citizens are eligible if they meet the above criteria

All respondents to the survey interested in participating in an interview will be redirected to a new survey window (separate Qualtrics questionnaire) to provide contact information separately from their survey responses. You are free to decide not to participate in this study or to withdraw at any time. There is no compensation for participating. However, your participation in this research may contribute to the efforts made by the government and relevant stakeholders to create an effective health care system that is culturally sensitive while interventions and eliminate alleviating some of the barriers to accessing care in Newfoundland and Labrador.

If you're wondering how often you would need to do these activities to reap the benefits, the answer is: as often as you can! More activities = more neuroplasticity!

Also note that some events are targeted to specific age groups or genders, so be sure to read all the details or contact the organization prior to an activity that you're interested in.
