First Voice and City of St. John's Form Joint Coordinating Committee on Indigenous Rights

The City of St. John's and First Voice Urban Indigenous Coalition have formed a Joint Coordinating Committee on Indigenous Rights.

The new committee will develop recommendations for implementing commitments outlined in Council's Declaration in Support of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.

The committee will report to Council and will consist of an equal number of staff representatives from First Light St. John's Friendship Centre and the City of St. John's. It will be co-chaired by Justin Campbell, Director of Advocacy with First Light, and Kevin Breen, City Manager at the City of St. John's.



Downtown Pedestrian Mall

The City of St. John's Downtown Pedestrian Mall (DPM) is set to open June 20 and run until September 2, 2024.

From noon until 10 p.m. daily, Water Street from Adelaide Street to Prescott Street will be closed to vehicles, with pedestrian traffic ramping up to take in the festivities and enjoy the energy and people-friendly vibe.

Government of Canada Introduces Legislation For Citizenship By Descent

Following the coming into force of the legislation, parents born abroad who have or adopt children also born outside Canada will need to have spent at least 1,095 cumulative days of physical presence in Canada prior to the birth or adoption of their child to pass on citizenship.

Virtual Information Sessions For Employers


It's almost time for our second round of FREE virtual information sessions for employers on immigration pathways and programs!


